OVERVIEW FOR 2010 – AVERAGE CROP REVENUE ELECTION (ACRE) PROGRAM

The Average Crop Revenue Election Program is a tool available for producers who participate in DCP to provide additional risk management options in the case of low prices and/or low production. Signup for 2010 will continue until June 1, 2010.

Both state and farm revenue must be lower than historical levels for ACRE payments to be issued.

2009 Outlook: If production remains the same as historical averages or are lower than average, ACRE payments will be significantly higher for wheat, barley, oats and corn.

PROS

Low production for the farm and the state could result in ACRE payments.

Price reduction is based on the average price for the previous two years, as opposed to an established price.

Since prices were high in 2007 and 2008, the base price we use for the 2009 revenue is high. This makes it more likely that ACRE payments will be provided.

Even if prices don't drop or aren't low enough for CC payments, low production could still result in payments for ACRE. **2010 Outlook:** If prices continue to drop, ACRE payments could still be high enough for wheat, barley, oats and corn to justify the 20% direct payment reduction for the next three years.

Bottom line: ACRE

provides an additional risk management tool, but not a guaranteed payment.
