Comments:

1.30.08 – San Joaquin County. “So far wheat surviving the saturated soils. Some yellowing plants showing up and obviously loss of nitrate N will be an issue down the road. Haven't seen any Stripe Rust in the few muddy fields I visited.” *Mick Canevari, Farm Advisor, UC Cooperative Extension, San Joaquin County.*

Follow-up, Last Week's bulletin (1.24.08):

Last week a grower from San Luis Obispo County commented that it was difficult to source Blanca Grande seed. Since that publication the Commission has received calls from two seed suppliers that have stated they have plenty of Blanca Grande seed to sell. The Commission will supply the grower with those sources. If you have trouble sourcing wheat seed, please feel free to contact the California Wheat Commission and we will be glad to assist you.
